

From the Desk of.....Fr. John The Epiphany of the Lord January 7, 2018

God revealed Himself to the Jews through the Scriptures, and to the Gentiles through nature. But the great thing about the Magi was their faith. Even though they were Gentiles, they recognized Christ as the Savior of the world. Like all men, these astrologers too were in constant search after human fulfillment, but they believed that only in the Savior Jesus could they finally find what they had been searching for all their lives.

We too are making our individual journeys, searching after something which alone will give meaning to our existence; we are searching for something permanent and eternal. Happily, for us, by the gift of faith in Christ, which we already possess, we are in no doubt that we can find our perfect fulfillment only in Jesus. But we need a guide for our spiritual journey as the Magi needed a star to guide them to Jesus.

Our guiding star is obviously the divine teachings of Christ. The more truly we follow our Lord's teaching in daily life, the more surely we will encounter him and the more easily he will be able to reveal himself to us. However, our journey towards a closer encounter with Christ will not all the time be smooth and easy; neither was it so for the Magi.

The Gospel says that when they set out on their journey, they saw the star 'as it rose' (Mat. 2:2). The next time the star is mentioned is on the road to Bethlehem as they neared the end of their journey. The implication seems to be that in between, they traveled in darkness. It was for them like a night-time journey between two ports.

It will be the same for us. As we start our journey on some road following our individual 'vocation' in life, trying to follow the teachings of Jesus as our guiding star, we may initially be attracted by a bright ideal or vision of hope. But when we are on our way, we must be ready to meet the clouds that would blot out the light of faith and make us stumble and the darkness of faith may even discourage us from continuing our journey towards Christ. But we must not be discouraged or give up. We must keep going on. If we are daring enough to keep going forward, we will see that the darkness will pass and once again we would have the glimpse of the initial star that we saw when we set out on our journey.



Are you new to Socorro? San Miguel Parish Welcomes You and invites You to visit the Office to Register in the Parish.




