From the desk of..... Deacon Nick Keller Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time January 28, 2018

In our Gospel today we hear these words, "A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." (Mark 1:27)

Jesus was teaching in the synagogue and the people were amazed at his ability to talk about the Kingdom of God. His teaching was extraordinary in that he taught without relying on the opinions and interpretations of others. He continues to exhibit his authority by rebuking an unclean spirit.

Now I realize that a lot of people today would look at this account and try to dismiss the demon possession as a primitive way of describing what we might call a mental illness. In other words, the ancients never really knew enough about medicine to make a positive diagnosis of A mental or psychological disorder, and instead would attribute such conditions to the realm of spiritual influence or demon possession. People who advocate such a position are therefore quick to dismiss the Biblical accounts of demon possession. I would agree that those ancient physicians did not know about issues like bi-polar conditions, depression, or psychosis. I would also argue that people afflicted with mental illnesses in the time of Jesus would be viewed as being possessed by an evil spirit.

If we meet someone who wants to dismiss the Bible accounts of demon possession as superstitious mumbo jumbo we can ask them one question. "Was it not Jesus who recognizes these evil spirits, and was it not Jesus who performs these miracles?" Jesus, being who He is, the Holy Son of God, was not limited by a lack of scientific knowledge or understanding. He knew exactly who and what He was dealing with, just as the demons clearly knew exactly who they were dealing with.

We need to remember that there are evil spirits in the world; C.S. Lewis provides us with the following advice: "There are two equal and opposite errors into which the human race can fall about devils. One is to disbelieve in their existence. The other is to believe, and to feel an excessive and unhealthy interest in them. They themselves are equally pleased by both errors."

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe has issued directives regarding liturgical practices during the 2018 flu season. During the Mass celebration the following steps will be taken:

- During the Sign of Peace, <u>instead of</u> shaking hands or hugging, as is practiced in some parishes, it would be best to simply nod your head and avoid bodily contact.
- When praying the Our Father, please do not hold hands. Simply extend your hands toward Heaven or fold your hands.
- Holy Communion will <u>not</u> be received under both species, just the Consecrated Host, not the Chalice.
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands just prior to distribution Holy Communion and should wash them immediately after distribution. If it is easier, an anti-bacterial gel can be used.

If you are sick, sneezing or coughing, it would be best for you to stay home. You are welcome to take advantage of the Sunday TV Masses which are available in English and Spanish. It is <u>not</u> a sin to miss Mass on Sundays if you are ill.

Due to these directives only two (2) EMHC's will be needed at the liturgical celebrations and these will be implemented at San Miguel & missions immediately. Where more than two EMHC's have been scheduled only the first two to sign in will be needed.

•If you have a family member, friend or neighbor who is ill and would like the sacrament of anointing for the sick please call the church.

•If you have a family member or know of someone who is ill and unable to come to church that wishes to receive Communion, to please call the church office to have them placed on a list.
