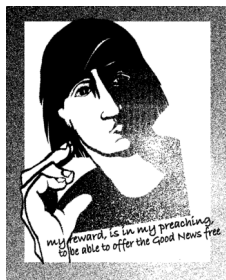
From The Desk of..... Bernadette Zamora
Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
February 4, 2018

This week I met up with an acquaintance. I don't remember her exact words, but she said something like she knows me and knows what I am really like. I am not sure what prompted her to say this, but I was like Job in today's reading. I woke up thinking about her words, about how hurt I was by them and what I did to make anyone think I am trying to act as though I am perfect. Reflecting on the readings today, I find comfort in them. God does not call perfect people to evangelize. Peter the first Pope denied Jesus three times, even Paul was far from the perfect apostle when Jesus called him. Paul in the second reading tells us that he is called to preach the Gospel. Paul, a devout Jew, who persecuted the early Christians, is called to preach the Gospel to the Gentiles. The Gentiles who were not thought very highly of by the Jews. He even says he became a slave to them. He also reminds us that being called to spread the gospel is not something to boast about.

God knows each and every one of us. Even though our friends and family might think they know us, only God knows our hearts and loves us in a way no one else can. We don't have to be perfect. When we take in the Eucharist, we become one with Christ, in all of our imperfections. The world is full of temptations, and only Jesus is perfect enough to resist those temptations. This is why Jesus came in the first place, to heal the sick, and bring the lost sheep back to God. In the Gospel today, Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law. She is sick with a fever. Jesus heals her and she immediately waited on them. The people brought all of their sick and those who were possessed by demons. They brought them to him because they knew that he could heal their loved ones, just as he can heal us today. We don't have to distance ourselves because of feelings of unworthiness. Jesus waits with open arms for all of us to return to him, the sacrament of Confession is a grace to reconcile us to him. No matter how bad we think we are, Jesus accepts us and washes us clean through his death and resurrection. Regardless of our history. All we have to do is answer his call and get to know him.

Jesus often went away by himself to pray. Today we see him go to a deserted place. Jesus needed time alone to pray. In today's busy world, we often are in need of time alone with Jesus. When we take time to connect with him in prayer, reading scriptures or other spiritual readings, we come closer to him. He is able to heal us, to strengthen us, and that makes us able to love him more intensely. In the busyness of the day, take a few minutes to get away from the chaos. Turn off the television, put away the cell phone, shut down the laptop, and open the Word. It is through the Word that we are able to know and love the Word, Jesus, and allow us to transform our hearts and lead us to eternal life. Pray for those who have hurt you, let go of the hurt and anger that keep you from experiencing fully the love of Christ.

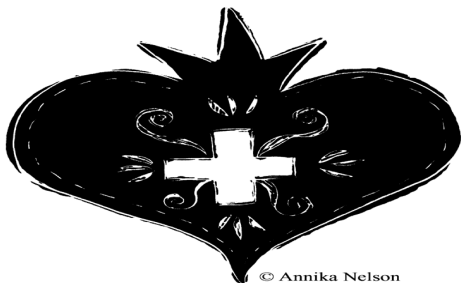

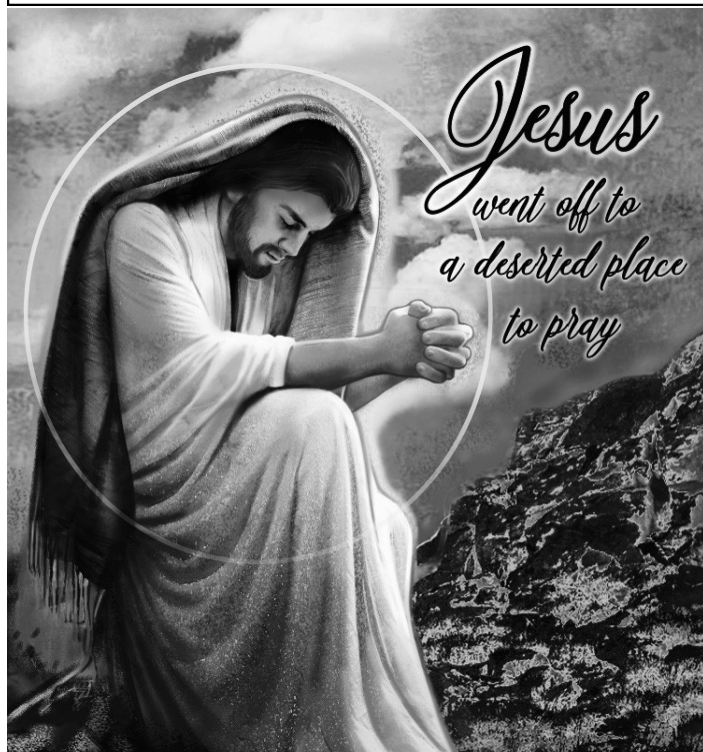
Agencies served by the Matthew 25 Ministry need donations and these may be brought to the church office during office hours.

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe has issued directives regarding liturgical practices during the 2018 flu season. During the Mass celebration the following steps will be taken:

- During the Sign of Peace, instead of shaking hands or hugging, as is practiced in some parishes, it would be best to simply nod your head and avoid bodily contact.
- When praying the Our Father, please do not hold hands. Simply extend your hands toward Heaven or fold your hands.
- Holy Communion will not be received under both species, just the Consecrated Host, not the Chalice.
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands just prior to distribution Holy Communion and should wash them immediately after distribution. If it is easier, an anti-bacterial gel can be used.

If you are sick, sneezing or coughing, it would be best for you to stay home. You are welcome to take advantage of the Sunday TV Masses which are available in English and Spanish. It is not a sin to miss Mass on Sundays if you are ill.

Due to these directives only two (2) EMHC's will be needed at the liturgical celebrations and these will be implemented at San Miguel & missions immediately. Where more than two EMHC's have been scheduled only the first two to sign in will be needed.

•If you have a family member, friend or neighbor who is ill and would like the sacrament of anointing for the sick please call the church.

•If you have a family member or know of someone who is ill and unable to come to church that wishes to receive Communion, to please call the church office to have them placed on a list.
