Dear Sisters and Brothers:


In today's Gospel Jesus requests that the leper tell no one of the miracle that cured the man. The leper completely ignoring Jesus told everyone he came across, ensuring that Jesus could no longer comfortably go into town and essentially was left to stay on the outskirts where even there he was constantly being approached by people about his healing abilities.

I can relate to this Gospel in a few ways: Like the leper, I have disobeyed Jesus, as well. Intentionally? No. Humanly? Yes. I find myself repeating the trend more often than I would like to admit, and this is not the first time I have written about it. When things get difficult for me instead of turning towards my Faith...I turn away. This is something I am constantly working on and still have a long way to go.

The last six months of my life has been full of unusual, saddening, and difficult events which have caused me to once again not turn towards the most powerful tools I have to help me in difficult times-Jesus, The Church, and Faith. The lesson I am learning is that there will always be difficult times and the best thing I can do for myself is to remember the support system I have in the Church and to remember that I do not have to do everything alone. I turn to you Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation.

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe has issued directives regarding liturgical practices during the 2018 flu season. During the Mass celebration the following steps will be taken:

During the Sign of Peace, <u>instead of</u> shaking hands or hugging, as is practiced in some parishes, it would be best to simply nod your head and avoid bodily contact.

- When praying the Our Father, please do not hold hands. Simply extend your hands toward Heaven or fold your hands.
- Holy Communion will <u>not</u> be received under both species, just the Consecrated Host, not the Chalice.
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands just prior to distribution Holy Communion and should wash them immediately after distribution. If it is easier, an anti-bacterial gel can be used.
- During the Flu Season those receiving Communion are encouraged to receive the Consecrated Host in the hand rather than the tongue.

If you are sick, sneezing or coughing, it would be best for you to stay home. You are welcome to take advantage of the Sunday TV Masses which are available in English and Spanish. It is not a sin to miss Mass on Sundays if you are ill.

Due to these directives only two (2) EMHC's will be needed at the liturgical celebrations and these will be implemented at San Miguel & missions immediately. Where more than two EMHC's have been scheduled only the first two to sign in will be needed.

•If you have a family member, friend or neighbor who is ill and would like the sacrament of anointing for the sick please call the church.

•If you have a family member or know of someone who is ill and unable to come to church that wishes to receive Communion, to please call the church office to have them placed on a list.
