Dear Sisters and Brothers:

This last Lent season I was more involved in my spirituality and faith than ever before. It was a very powerful thing. One of my workout friends and I were having a conversation about nutrition about a month before Lent and I decided the 2 highest caloric things I ingest were alcohol and cheese. After realizing I wouldn't do well in prison, I gave up the latter of the two. Once Lent started I continued with the 'No Cheese' rule. In the beginning it was a little rough. I mean think about it; everything that is delicious has cheese: Nachos, Enchiladas, Pizza, Tacos, Lasagna, the list goes on and on. I stayed strong and made it and by the time Easter approached I rarely even thought about it. On Easter Sunday after Mass I decided that because I was in Mexico I should really have some Mexican Food. I ordered a Chili Relleno and Enchilada. As I waited for that delicious melty cheese to arrive I could feel the excitement building. At this point it had been almost 70 days without it. As I took my first bite I was a little taken aback. It really wasn't that exciting. After the meal I decided that I would just continue, considering I was already used to it and if I wanted I could enjoy some cheese occasionally. The thought I kept going back to was that the whole Lent season I thought I was sacrificing something substantial. However, I really didn't sacrifice anything. In fact, it made me realize that as humans we tend to forget the biggest sacrifice Jesus made for us. His life. It makes our Lenten promises seem quite small compared. As we continue in this Easter Season let us continually try to improve our lives and grow in our faith every day.



The Archdiocese of Santa Fe has issued directives regarding liturgical practices during the 2018 flu season. During the Mass celebration the following steps will be taken:

During the Sign of Peace, <u>instead of</u> shaking hands or hugging, as is practiced in some parishes, it would be best to simply nod your head and avoid bodily contact.

- When praying the Our Father, please do not hold hands. Simply extend your hands toward Heaven or fold your hands.
- Holy Communion will <u>not</u> be received under both species, just the Consecrated Host, not the Chalice.
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands just prior to distribution Holy Communion and should wash them immediately after distribution. If it is easier, an anti-bacterial gel can be used.
- During the Flu Season those receiving Communion are encouraged to receive the Consecrated Host in the hand rather than the tongue.

If you are sick, sneezing or coughing, it would be best for you to stay home. You are welcome to take advantage of the Sunday TV Masses which are available in English and Spanish. It is <u>not</u> a sin to miss Mass on Sundays if you are ill.

•If you have a family member, friend or neighbor who is ill and would like the sacrament of anointing for the sick please call the church.

•If you have a family member or know of someone who is ill and unable to come to church that wishes to receive Communion, to please call the church office to have them placed on a list.
