

From the Desk of...... Bernadette Zamora Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 12, 2018

Today's first reading reminds me of something that Saint Padre Pio once said, "The most beautiful creed is one we pronounce in the hour of darkness." In today's reading, Elijah is done, he lays down and actually prayed for death. This is a reminder that it is easy to praise God and be happy when everything in life is going our way, anyone can do that. Life, however is not easy all the time. Anything can happen to turn everything upside down. Those are the times that we have to hold tight to our faith and find strength in our Lord. When we go through these rough times it is often the support of our family and friends that give us the strength to continue just like the Angel in today's reading helped Elijah.

On Friday, George and I celebrated our 22nd wedding anniversary. In those years we have been blessed to celebrate some very happy times. We have also had to endure some difficult times as well. There has been illness, such as Kateri having to endure a difficult surgery to straighten her spine. Elijah wanted to give up, but God had other plans. This is a reminder to us that God will always take care of us, not matter what is happening to us in our life. It is important to remember that when we are suffering. Now that George is struggling with an incurable illness, the reality of the Gospel is even more of a reality. This illness will not end in death, but a new life. The promise of Jesus in today's gospel reminds us that if we believe in him, he will raise us on the last day. As we continue on this journey together, we will continue to do as the second reading guides us to do. Not to be angry or bitter about what is happening, but instead to be grateful for the life we have had together and cherish each moment that we have. We do that through the many prayers that go out for all of us. You have all been to us like the angel in today's first reading. Your assistance and prayers during this difficult time for our family have strengthened and guided us. I appreciate each and every one of you.

Today as you go on about your week, be open to the blessings that are placed in our lives. A smile from a stranger when you are feeling down, the smell of the flower as you are walking down the street, or even the fresh smell after a rain. Remember to take time to open yourself to the message that Jesus has for you. Take time to pray and read scripture. May God Bless you, and to my husband, Happy Anniversary.


