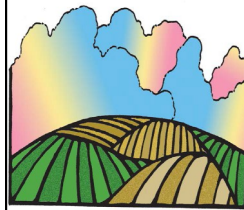

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time
November 11, 2018

The readings today emphasize the need to trust God completely. It is often difficult to put complete trust in God when life becomes difficult. These are the times that it is most important to trust that God is in charge and will provide for everything that we need. God does not want us to keep the worry to ourselves, he wants us to put our faith in him. He will always take care of our needs better than we can imagine. Even when everything seems to be falling apart, life becomes difficult, we must trust God, just as the widow in the first reading.

The poor widow collecting sticks to make a final meal for her and her son, then here comes Elijah asking her for it. This widow showed an immense amount of faith by giving that bread she made with it to him. In those days there was not Department of Health and Human Services to come to the aid of the poor, she had no means to buy more flour and oil. She gives all that she had to Elijah, even though she knew that she and her son would die of hunger. She had complete faith in God, and that faith was rewarded. God wants us to have complete faith in him just as this widow had.

In the second reading St. Paul reminds us that Christ gave up his very life so that we can have eternal life. His sacrifice was given freely, because God loves each of us so much that he wants to be reunited with us. Christ paid the price of our sins with his very life, he gave up his own life for us. All he wants in return is for us to have faith in him.

The poor widow in the Gospel, just like the widow in the first reading, gives all she has back to God. It is not about how much we give it is about putting all our trust in him. It is so easy to have faith when life is going well, when we have a good job, we have a home to live in, and we have a reliable vehicle to get around in. We want to be thankful during these times because we have been blessed. God does not want us to give up these things, he wants us to put him first in everything we do. Our time on this earth is short, nothing in this life is permanent, we must remember that our goal in this life is the Journey to Heaven after. This is our goal in life, to be able to be reunited to God when the journey in this life is over. This is our final goal, and being rich or poor doesn't matter, it is how much faith we have in him and how much of our life we give to him now.

Take time this week to give a few moments back to God in prayer. May God bless you always and have a wonderful week.

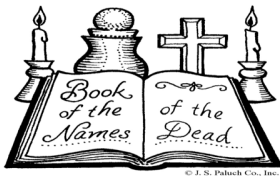
All Souls Book of Remembrance November 2018

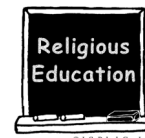
