



From the Desk of...... T J Chester Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time February 24, 2019

The words from today's Gospel are familiar to us. They constitute the challenges of what it means to be a disciple: Love your enemies, turn the other cheek, give to those who ask, do unto others, lend without expecting repayment, judge not lest you be judged.

"An eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, life for life" was the practice amongst the Jews at the time of Christ and for centuries before (Ex. 21:23-25). Christ sets up the "golden rule" of fraternal charity in place of this Law of Talion. Every man should truly love his neighbor for he is his brother. What is more, Christ's mission on earth has made all of us sons and daughters of God and heirs to heaven. Our chief interest in our neighbor must therefore be a spiritual interest. If our neighbor offends us, he offends God which is much more serious. Our charity should help him to seek God's forgiveness.

At first sight it appears that the demands that Christ makes on our charity here are anything but easy. Loving one's enemies is asking a lot. Blessing them and praying for them after they have offended us seems to be going very far. Asking for a blow on the second cheek while the first is still twinging with pain seems fit only for a martyr. Not to try to take back what was stolen from us looks very foolish.

However, before we give up in despair, let us look a little more closely at the demands that are made. To love our enemy does not mean we must throw our arms about him every time we meet him. t means we must do all in our power to rid our minds of any hatred of him and try to see the good that is in him. Not judging and condemning comes under this heading. As humans, and as the sinful beings that we are, our faculty for seeing in our neighbor the real person as he is before God, is very limited and very prone to error.

Since it was Christ who made all these demands, we must make a sincere effort to follow his example and his guidance. These teachings are so against our current ways of thinking. Yet, these same teachings would revolutionize our present world if we all exemplified them. The challenge is not to think: "Nobody lives that way." Rather, we should be thinking: "How can I live this way because Jesus has invited me to live this way?"




