

From the Desk of.....Robert Aerts 4th Sunday of Lent March 31, 2019

Today's readings are about reward and reconciliation.

In Joshua, after the Israelites have wandered in the desert for forty years, they've crossed the Jordan River and have finally reached the Promised Land. This didn't happen until the generation that left Egypt with Moses had died out. Only Joshua and Caleb entered with the new generation. The Promised Land was what God had promised Moses, now the reward was granted.

In Second Corinthians, Paul teaches that God has reconciled us to himself through Christ, and given us (Christ's ministers through the Apostles and all ordained ministers to this day) the message of reconciliation. Paul also states, "We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God."

In today's Gospel from St. Luke, we hear the parable of the prodigal son and his return to be reconciled with his father. He realizes his errors, and wants to make amends, even to be treated as one of the hired workers. His father, who for some time had been eagerly awaiting his return, welcomes him back with open arms and feasting. At this, the other son who stayed home and remained faithful cannot as easily forgive his brother as his father has quickly done.

Paragraph 1457 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year." Serious sins should be confessed prior to receiving Holy Communion.

So dearly does Jesus want each of us to be in His good grace's, that in the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina, paragraph 1728, Jesus had her write ... "I cannot love a soul which is stained with sin; but when it repents, there is no limit to my generosity toward it... My Heart rejoices when they return to me." In paragraph 723 of the Diary, Jesus lets her know that His Divine Mercy is there for those most in need. "The greater the sinner, the greater is His mercy."

Today's parable speaks to each one of us. Jesus eagerly awaits our return to the Father. He awaits us with open arms and has given us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to free us of any offenses we may have committed. Through our priest, Jesus hears our confession and grants forgiveness, despite the seriousness of our failings.


