From the Desk of.....Fr. John Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord April 14, 2019

Luke's Passion Narrative resembles that of Mark but has its own emphasis. The devil who departed from Jesus after the temptations returns now, entering Judas and demanding to sift Peter. Throughout his Gospel, Luke portrays Jesus as the merciful and forgiving Savior of humankind; in death He forgives his executioners, and on the cross, He brings salvation to a criminal.

To understand the Passion message, we have to keep in mind the other biblical writings of Luke: The Acts of the Apostles. The Jesus who is accused by the chief priests before the Roman governor prepares the way for Paul being brought before the same cast of adversaries. The innocent Jesus who dies asking forgiveness for his enemies and commending His soul to God the Father prepares the way for the first Christian martyr, Stephen, who will die voicing similar sentiments.

Today's liturgy recalls Jesus' parade and triumphant entry into Jerusalem which led Him into His passion. This parade which began outside of Jerusalem led Him to the cross as we hear in the reading of the passion. In the passion, we hear of another parade where the mood is different and the absences more noticeable. Can we join the parade that Jesus Christ began? We know where it is leading. Are we onlookers watching unmoved? Does it matter to us enough to join?

Today the Church asks us to be part of Jesus' journey to proclaim that it matters to us what happened to Him. Let us demonstrate our love and our thanks to Him for heading towards Jerusalem to die in order to offer us salvation.
