From the Desk ofBernadette Zamora
Third Sunday of Easter
May 5, 2019

Today we celebrate the third Sunday of Easter. While most have long put away the Easter decorations, and Easter is just a distant memory, we as a Christian Community are still celebrating the Risen Lord. In today's Gospel, the Apostles meet Jesus for the third time. They have gone back to their lives from before they met Jesus. They have seen him two other times, but still do not recognize him. There are seven of them on the boat and not one of them recognize him. There are many times in my life that I do not recognize that Jesus is speaking to me or sending me a message. I use the excuse that I am too busy, but is that really true? When I honestly think about how busy I am (and I honestly am very busy), I know that I actually can fit prayer and scripture reading into my schedule. It is easy to say, "I don't have time for prayer;" when in reality, I can find time for prayer. Jesus is waiting for us to come to him, just as he is waiting for the Apostles to come to the shore in today's gospel. Jesus asks Peter not once but three times if Peter loves him. Peter must have had an immense amount of guilt because he had just denied Jesus three times. Peter makes a good point in today's gospel though, one we should never forget, "Lord, you know everything." We have to remember this, Jesus does know everything, he is calling each one of us as he called Peter to tend his sheep, we are also called to continue Jesus' message to all of his people. In the first reading, we see the apostles facing great obstacles in spreading this message.

The first reading gives an important lesson for us today. Today's laws often contradict God's law. Laws that go against our faith. The apostles tell the Sanhedrin they have to obey God, not man's law. Jesus gives us the strength and knowledge to be faithful to him. The only way to be able to access the knowledge of Jesus message is through taking the time learn and grow. It may be the bible, Catholic authors, and most especially the mass. Mass is an opportunity to listen to the word and learn from it, then receive the body of Christ in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the most important part of our life, without it we are spiritually hungry. We are not able to be strong in our faith if we are not receiving the proper nourishment. The second reading provides us with an image of what we can receive by our faithfulness to Jesus in our daily lives.

The second reading is a beautiful image of heaven. No matter what we go through in this life, we have the opportunity through Jesus Christ, to be in heaven with him will all creation as we praise God with them. Take time out of your busy life to open your mind and heart to the message of Jesus through scripture or other spiritual writings. May God Bless you and your family.

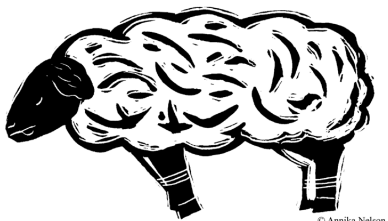

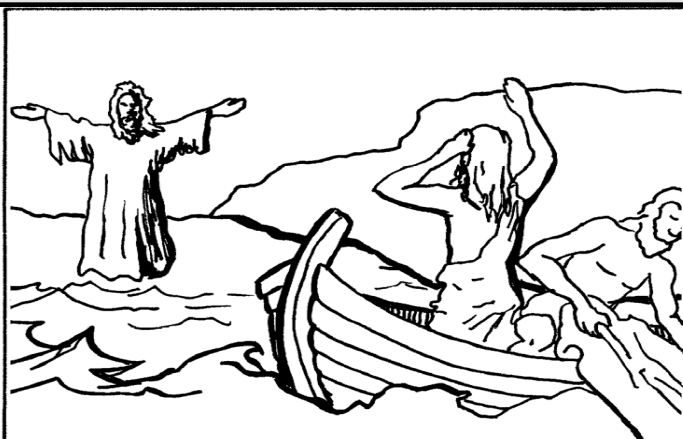

- Creates jobs in recycling industries.

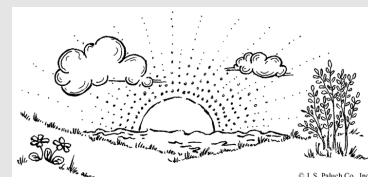
Where to Recycle in Socorro:

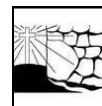
