

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
August 4, 2019


This week's readings focus on our Journey to heaven. I know for myself; I don't like to think about death and dying. Ever since my older brother died when I was five, I have always been afraid to die. I remember at times the fear would envelope me, at five years old, I didn't understand nor did I have the skills to cope with the death of a sibling so close in age. It is different when we are older. As an adult, when someone close to you is facing death, it has a way of changing things. I read today's readings and it reminds me that the focus of my attention is not what I cannot change, but on Christ. I am reminded that this life is not meant to last forever, it is a temporary world, a short stay into our journey which will last for eternity, heaven.

The first reading seems harsh, but it is a reality that we all must face. This reality is that nothing in this world that we gain will have an effect on our eternal journey. We may have times of worry that our bills paid, that we don't have enough saved, that we don't like our job. Yes, these things are important, but a Christ centered life is the most important part of our Earthly stay on our journey. The Eucharist is how we are able to share in the unity with Christ. We should never take the Eucharist for granted and make an effort to receive Christ in the Blessed Sacrament at least weekly. Paul in the second reading explains this further.

The second reading reminds us that we were raised with Christ, and we should stay focused first and foremost on what is above, not what we can gain on Earth. Yes, work hard, make a living, and pay our obligations; but first and foremost, keep Christ at the center of everything. Living an honest life, putting on Christ, and treating each other with respect and dignity. Christ is in each and every one of us, no matter what kind of life the other person is living, that person was also created for Christ; even if they are not attending mass. Someone who has made himself or herself absent from Mass may have suffered a hurtful experience. They are missing out on the Eucharist and we should especially treat them with kindness and love. The Gospel today explains this.

This week's Gospel is a reminder of the harsh reality of life. We will sometimes have disagreements with other members of the Body of Christ. We are all One, we share in the Eucharist together. We should share it in love. When someone is missing, our family is incomplete. Has someone you know stopped coming to mass? It happens to each of us. Let that person know how much he or she is missed. It is a natural reaction to remind him or her of the teaching of being in a state of mortal sin. Even to say that he or she is going to hell, which is against Catholic teaching. We do not have the authority to judge anyone to hell. By doing this, we will possibly turn the person further away, and put ourselves in the state of mortal sin. Instead, try telling that person that he or she is missed, that mass is not the same without him or her. Show the person love and compassion. This will make the person feel that they are an important part of the Body of Christ. This is how we can live the Gospel message, to help the person who is hurting come back to be healed.

This week, take time to pray for Christian Unity. Also, think about how you can live the Gospel message and store treasures in heaven. Become rich in the things that matter to God.




