From the desk of...... Kirstin Keller Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 18, 2019

This week's Gospel is a powerful message from Jesus. He gives us a glimpse into the true insight of what he feels is his utmost mission. He truly shows us his heart in this Gospel:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!

There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished! Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother, a mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law.'' (Lk 12:49-53)

Not only is this Gospel powerful; it is also frightening and transparently truthful.

When we envision the earth on fire, a blazing earth-it brings fantastic imagery of the Christian Faith having the energy and stamina that Jesus so desires to come from his teachings and work. Jesus can also be seen in this Gospel as a little bit of a troublemaker with the fire of his message and love. His message will divide people, and many times that division is right in our own homes. This division can also be within ourselves and Jesus as we struggle to do what is Right and Just versus what is Safe and Comfortable.

The beauty of this week's Gospel is that it has the power to rekindle our Faith and can resuscitate our Love and Mission on this Earth as well!


