From the Desk of.....Ann Hook  
27th Sunday in Ordinary Time  
October 6, 2019

Garth Brooks' 1994, hit song, "Unanswered Prayers," is about a young man who felt God did not answer his prayer. At times, most of us have felt disheartened and frustrated because we thought God was not listening to us and answering our prayers. We have prayed for worthy causes, the health and well-being of loved ones, justice, and peace. We wondered why God did not respond immediately and in the way we desired. We did not know and we cannot know while on earth. An analogy is that during our time on earth we are seeing one side of a tapestry. On earth, we only see the reverse side of the tapestry. There are some smooth beautiful places, but there are also rough, snarled, and knotted places. These rough places are the difficult times of our lives: the times we have prayed and felt that God did not listen and did not answer our prayers. In heaven, we will see the front of the tapestry in its exquisite beauty. We will see how good was woven through the rough snarled patches. Then we will see how God did answer our prayers for our good and the good of those we love.

In today's first reading, the prophet Habakkuk is frustrated because he feels God is not answering his prayers concerning injustices within Judean society. "*How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen!*" (Hb 1:2). God is listening but His response brings violence upon the perpetrators of the injustices. Habakkuk prays again, now for God's mercy. God's response is the latter part of today's reading (Hb 2:2-4). He tells the prophet to write down His message indicating its importance for future generations. His message is that we must wait patiently and trust in God's justice.

As God tells us in the Book of Habakkuk, we must be patient. Patience is very difficult and requires strong faith. Faith enables us to be patient and trust in God. Today's Gospel (Lk 17:6) assures us that even if we have only a small amount of faith - the size of a mustard seed - it is large enough. However, this precious gift of faith must be nurtured like a seed, otherwise, it will become dormant. Prayer both private and communal nurture faith. In addition to Mass, we have other opportunities for communal prayer. The Rosary is recited before Sunday Masses and after daily Masses. The Charismatic Prayer Group meets on Thursday evenings. Continuing to learn nurtures faith. Currently, there is a class on the **Bible Timeline**. Classes, such as this one, enable us to learn, deepen our faith, and engage in "holy conversation." Another educational opportunity is the Wednesday morning Book Club. Beginning on **October 16<sup>th</sup>** the book club will discuss **Left to Tell** by Immaculee Ilibagiza, the true story of a young woman who survived the Rwandan holocaust. It is a story of the power of faith, prayer, and healing power of forgiveness.

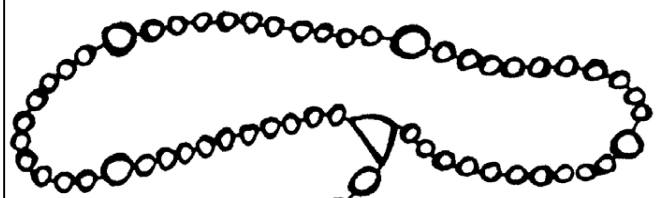
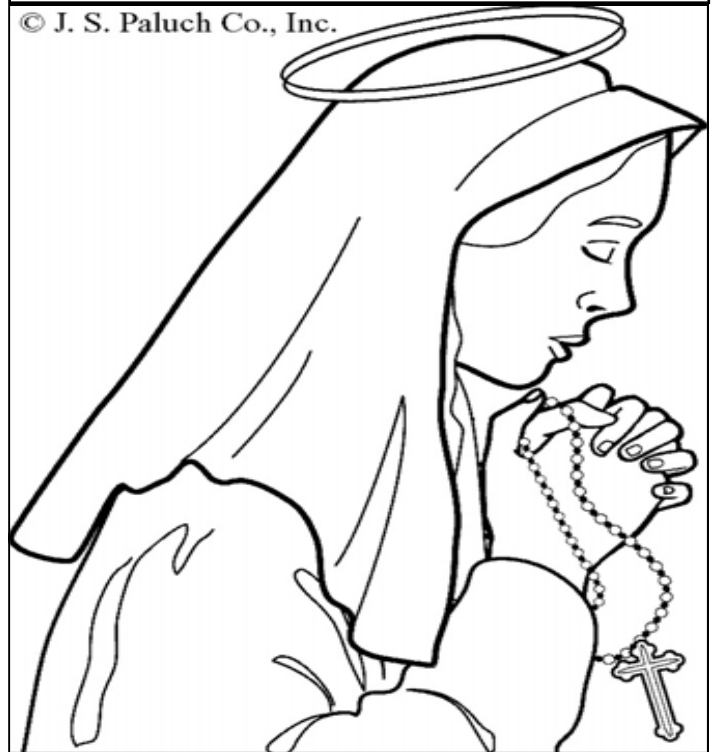
