

### From the Desk of..... Bernadette Zamora Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 20, 2019

The readings today all have a common message that is to remain true to our faith and pray. In the first reading Israel is under attack and Joshua goes out to fight against them. He could not do it alone though; Moses prayer and outstretched arms gave Joshua and his army the strength to fight. Moses even got tired and needed assistance, Aaron and Hur held up his hands when Moses got tired.

How many times in life does it get to be too much, and we need someone to hold us up? Sometimes, it is the prayers of others that give us strength during those times; even though they may not know you are praying for them. It is when we are struggling, but continue to remain faithful and pray when it is most difficult, that we send a message to those around us.

The second reading that Paul is writing to Timothy is an example of this. St. Paul's message is for us to remain persistent. What would have happened to us if the Apostles had not remained persistent? We know that all but St. John were martyred for their faith. There were also many Christians who died in the early church as well. If our early Church fathers had not remained persistent, even in times of trouble, we would not have the Church that we have today. St. Paul is reminding us to remain persistent even when it is difficult and share that faith with others.

Jesus in the gospel today is a lesson to pray even when it is difficult. The Judge in the parable in the Gospel reading today is not a good person, Jesus even says he does not fear God or respect humans. Because of the widow's constant petitions for help with her cause, he ruled in her favor. This parable is not saying that God is like the Judge; it is a reminder that God is a loving and kind father who always wants what is best for us. God will do so much more than a Judge who does not even fear God. This parable ends with a striking question, "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on Earth?" This is a reminder of what we are waiting for, what our life is for. The coming of Christ, Eternal life.

It is not always easy to pray. Like Moses, we sometimes need someone to hold us up. I know that the prayers of my friends and family have brought me through some very difficult times. If you are finding it difficult to pray, it is okay to ask for prayers. Those prayers we give for others may seem insignificant, but God hears those prayers and answers them.

Take time every day this week to spend time in prayer. Let God work through you and heal all the pain and sorrow.
