Salt and Light

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells His disciples that they are the "salt of the earth" and "light of the world". When I thought about the first statement, I remembered the times I neglected to add salt to a recipe. Despite whatever else the recipe contained; the result was tasteless. It had no flavor; it was not good. Salt not only gives food flavor, but also has been used to preserve food throughout history. Also, salt is essential to life. When I thought about light, I thought about the sun and how it floods the world with brightness every day. Providing our eyesight is good, we are able to see. What would it be like to live without light, to be unable to see? We may not know where we are or if we are in danger. It would be frightening. We wouldn't be able to enjoy the beauty of nature or see the faces of loved ones. It would be a gloomy and lonely existence.

With the analogy of salt, Jesus was telling His disciples to bring the goodness of the Gospel to their communities, just as salt brings flavor to food. Just as salt preserves food, they were to preserve the Gospel and pass it on to their communities. Just as salt is essential to life, the disciples were to show their communities the way to eternal life through living the Gospel.

With the analogy of light, Jesus was telling His disciples that they were to illuminate the path to peace and security by doing God's will, just as light allows us to navigate safely. Just as light brings joy to our lives with beauty, they were to show their communities the way to true happiness, by doing God's will. Just as light enables us to see the faces of loved ones, the disciples were to demonstrate to their communities how to love their neighbors.

Christians are disciples of Jesus. Just as those listening to Jesus' words more than two thousand years ago, we are called to be salt and light in our communities. We are called to live the Gospel's message within today's society, treating everyone with justice, kindness, and respect, Social Justice. The teachings of the Catholic Church on Social Justice direct us to live the Gospel's message in a troubled world. These teachings are grounded in Sacred Scripture, Catholic Teaching, and Catholic Social Tradition. There are seven themes of Catholic Social Teaching one of which is *Solidarity* – we are one human family. January 30th, the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of coronavirus a global health emergency, clearly illustrating that we live in an interconnected society. We do not live within the isolation of our families and towns. What affects someone anywhere in the world can affect us. The Catholic Church's teaching on *Solidarity* instructs us that we are our brothers' keepers, wherever and whomever they may be.

These lyrics from the 1960's song, *He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother*, "His welfare is my concern/ No burden is he to bear" express the theme of *Solidarity*.

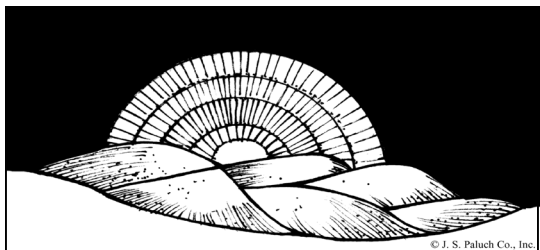

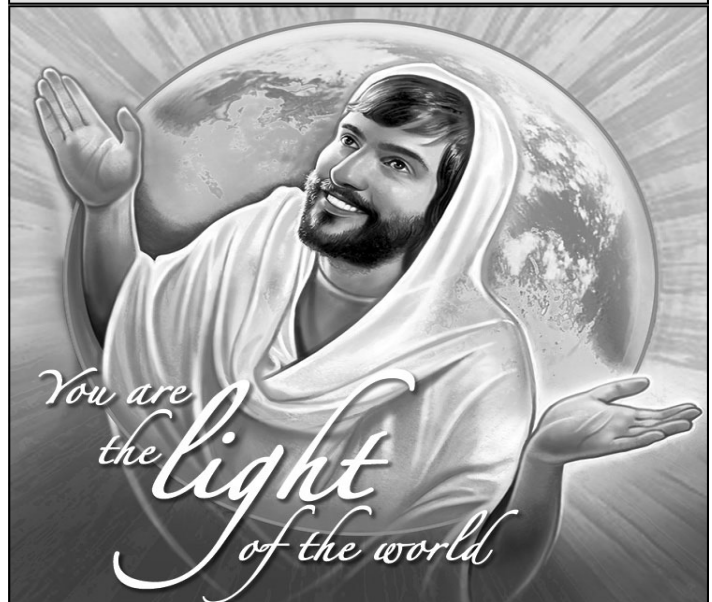

Pilgrimage For Healing

In September of this year Archbishop Wester declared the period between September 14, 2019 and April 10, 2020, to be a period of pilgrimage, with El Cerro de Tomé as one of the pilgrimage destinations. San Miguel parishioner, Ricardo Berry, whose father built the Calvary monument on El Cerro de Tomé, is organizing a group pilgrimage to El Cerro during the Lenten season. The proposed pilgrimage for healing would consist of about a ten mile walk, beginning at the intersection of State Highway 47 and Highway 309 (East River Road) to the summit of El Cerro de Tomé. The pilgrimage route will pass by the Immaculate Conception Church in Tomé where the group will take a scheduled break for rest and prayer. Pilgrims who are not able to walk the entire route can join the group there for the final two miles.

Proposed Pilgrimage Schedule
(times are approximate / date to be determined)

- 8:00 a.m. Initial prayer service at San Miguel
- 8:30 a.m. Carpool from San Miguel to starting point
- 9:30 a.m. Arrive at starting spot and begin walking to El Cerro de Tomé
- 1:30 p.m. Arrive at Immaculate Conception Church. Meet other pilgrims who opt for the shorter walk
- 3:00 p.m. Begin climbing El Cerro de Tomé / Pray the Stations of the Cross
- 4:30 p.m. Complete the climb and Stations of the Cross
- 5:00 p.m. Carpool back to Socorro
- 6:00 p.m. Concluding prayer service at San Miguel

The journey itself will consist of contemplation and personal prayer during walking, and group prayer and singing during occasional rest stops. Participants will provide their own water and food. Additional details, including a date, will be developed with input from people who wish to participate.
