

### From the Desk of.....T J Chester Fifth Sunday of Easter May 10, 2020

When you are asked: "Are you saved"? The Catholic answer to this is "Yes" in three ways: We are saved by grace through Baptism, we continue to be saved by God's grace and mercy as we freely choose to follow Him, and we hope to be saved in our final hour so as to enter the glories of Heaven.

How are we saved? How is it that we were, are and hope to receive the precious gift of salvation? The answer is simple: Through the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ our one and only Way to the Father. There is no other way we obtain salvation than through Him.

This discussion is especially familiar among our evangelical Christian brothers and sisters. But Catholics should be quite familiar with this topic. At the heart of this conversation is the Person of Jesus Christ.

Jesus alone must be the central focus of our lives and we must see Him as the Way, the Truth and the Life. He is the only Way to Heaven, He is the fullness of the Truth we must believe, and He is the Life that we are called to live

In today's Gospel, Jesus is not talking about where he is going as a place with an address; nor does he call it heaven. Jesus is talking about relationships, his and our relationship with the father. Through faith, the disciples will be able to recognize the relationship that already exists between Jesus and his father. Ultimately, faith and trust in God will allow his followers to enter fully into that divine relationship. That is "the way, the life" in his truthfully proclaiming himself: "The way, the truth and the life."

Jesus assures his listeners that they who believe in him will do the works he does—and even greater works. The list is long: caring for the sick, comforting those in pain, protecting the weak and vulnerable, embracing the poor, defending the rights of the victimized, denouncing injustice, etc.

We also see how differences and disputes were resolved in the church's early days. The Hellenist (converts whose language was Greek), complained that their widows were not getting a fair share of the church's social services. The apostles' solution to the problem shows how changes of practice are not only possible but necessary for the health of the church.

The solution shows two important dimensions of church life: prayer and service; and that living our Catholic vocation requires a balance between the two. Each of us is personally called to prayer, to a dialogue of worship with God; and we are also called to service. No matter what we do in life, our work affects others in some way. We should be of service to our neighbors; and provided we have an attitude of respect, no task we do is a menial task. Prayer and preaching the word was of primary importance to the apostles; but service to the widows and the needy in the community was also vital.

As a result, the number of disciples in Jerusalem increased. How can this kind of growth in the church be revived in our day? Is the word of the Lord still spreading? In St. Peter's letter, the church is imagined as a spiritual temple, with we as living stones making up a living house of God. Every time we say the Lord's Prayer, we say 'thy kingdom come.' This implies taking some responsibility for spreading the word and doing something to build up the church. We can work for God's kingdom by our daily conduct and attitudes.

The cornerstone of the church is Christ himself, and he offers us encouragement. If he is going away, it is to prepare a place for us in his Father's house, which has many rooms. There is a place for us all in the kingdom. Each person has gifts of nature and grace and each should have a say in church life.

Many people today regard faith as irrelevant because their notion of God is faulty or distorted. For an authentic picture of what God is like, we should look to Jesus, who said "I am in the Father and the Father is in me." He shows what the invisible Father is like: concerned for all, interested in all, respecting everyone, calling sinners back home. This welcoming God is the one that our church worships, and we renew our trust in Him.






### **WELCOME!**
