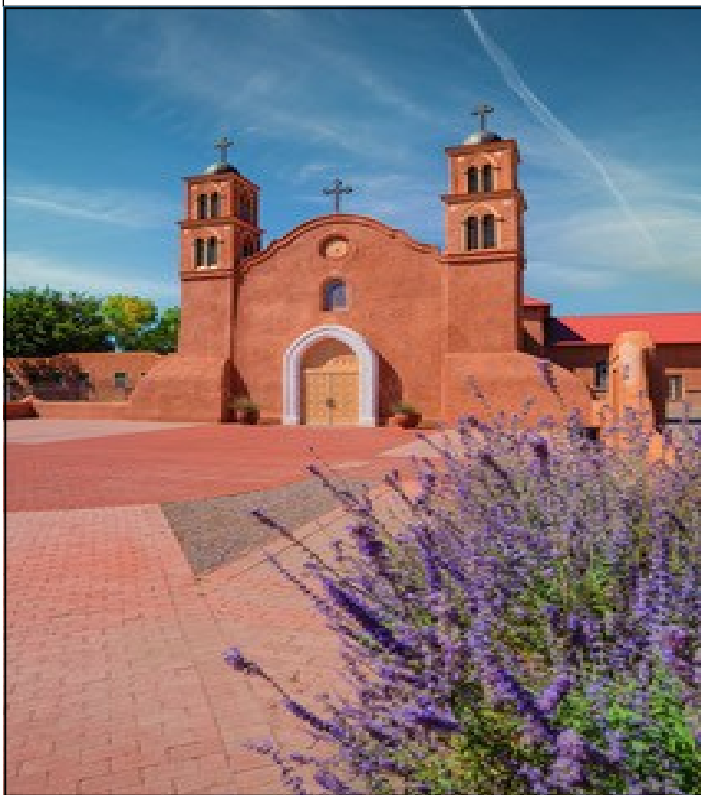

Parish Vision Statement

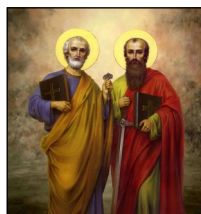

Rosaries at San Miguel can be prayed at 9:30 AM before the funeral Mass at 10:00 AM or the night before.



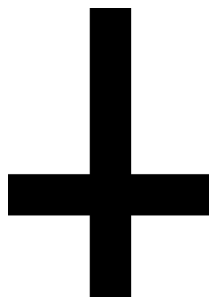
Funerals at St. Mary Magdalene may be scheduled on Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays or Saturdays.

The Cross of St. Peter,

also known as the Inverted Cross, is a Christian symbol traditionally associated with Saint Peter the Apostle. The origin of the symbol comes from the tradition that Saint Peter was crucified upside down.

This narrative first appears in a non-canonical (but influential in early Christian tradition) work titled *The Acts of Peter* (section 37-39), thought to be written around AD 180-200.

The text elaborates on two points. The first, that Peter wished to die this way because he was not worthy to die in the same manner as his Lord, Jesus Christ. The second, that Peter chose this position to demonstrate humility and to show a symbolic inversion of the world, interpreting the crucifixion upside down as a theological symbol of transformation, where life through Christ turns the world's values upside down.

Peter's upside-down crucifixion is also mentioned by Origen in his lost *Commentary on Genesis* as quoted by Eusebius in his work *Church History* (Book 3, Chapter 1), by St. Jerome in his work, *De Viris Illustribus* ("On Illustrious Men"), written around A.D. 392 (Chapter 1) and by Ambrose of Milan (c. 340–397 A.D.) where in *Expositio Evangelii secundum Lucam* (10.70), Ambrose refers to Peter's upside-down crucifixion.

However, in modern times the Cross of St. Peter has been misappropriated, especially in popular culture, horror media, and some anti-Christian or occult-themed art, to falsely represent Satanism or opposition to Christianity. The Catholic Church still reveres the inverted cross as a sacred symbol of St. Peter. It is present in St. Peter's Basilica and Papal symbols and is associated with the office of the Pope, as Peter's successor.
