From the Desk of..... Bernadette Zamora Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 13, 2017

In the readings today, we hear several stories about the faith of our forefathers. In the first reading, Elijah is in a cave when the Lord tells him that he will be passing by. Elijah hears many loud sounds; a strong wind, crushing rocks, an earthquake and even a fire. God was not in any of the awesome events that Elijah sees and hears; instead, he is the tiny whisper. Elijah hides his face in his cloak when he hears him. This grace which allows Elijah to hear Gods voice is because of his faith. This faith is nurtured through prayer and learning scripture. This faith is not something that is automatically given to Elijah and it is not automatically given to us either, we also much nurture our faith through prayer and reading scripture.

In the second reading, Paul is saddened by the lack of faith of the Israelites. The covenant is theirs, between God and them. They are the chosen ones whom God delivered from Pharaoh, they are the people who Jesus came to give eternal life. They rejected him. Paul is so torn about this that he is willing to be cut off from Christ if it would cause them to accept Christ. This is the amount of love that Paul has for his people. He wants them to have the salvation that comes from Christ. This salvation; however, is not something that is forced, it must be willingly accepted. God wants nothing more than for us to love him. We only need to answer his call, and spend time with him in prayer.

Jesus goes away to pray by himself, he often goes away by himself to pray. Prayer is an important part of Jesus' life, he often goes away to pray. Prayer is where we get the strength to continue when life gets so difficult and everything is going wrong. Even though our faith may waver, and we feel that God is nowhere to be found. God will never abandon us. Peter today, has a moment of weakness. He became frightened and began to sink. I have felt as though I am sinking, as though I can't take much more. I find my faith is not strong enough to carry me through. Peter has this moment, he is literally sinking. There is wind, he is walking on the water and he loses his faith. Jesus even tells him "Oh you of little faith. Why did you doubt" (Mt. 14: 31). Even though Peter doubted, Jesus did not let him sink. He reached out his hand to take Peter's. Like Peter, we must remember that even when we have doubts, Jesus is always there waiting with an outstretched hand. Although at times we feel as though we are all alone, carrying our burdens and Jesus is nowhere to be found. At those times it is most important that we remember that He is there. Always, he will never leave us. This is when our prayer is most important. It is what carries us through the hard times. God will never abandon us, even if we have lost our way. He is waiting for us.


Adult Confirmation
