

From the Desk of.....Fr. John
Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time
March 3, 2019

Just as an orchard is judged by the quality of its fruits, so a person's talk shows what kind of person he or she is. It is easy to see another's weakness and faults, but a psychological wall prevents us from seeing our own. Each of us has a plank in our eyes which blinds us to our faults.

To be critical of others, while at the same time lacking any sense of self-criticism is a profitless pastime. To expect high standards from others, while readily finding excuses for our own lack-luster performance can only be a fruitless exercise. Our criticism of others may be true, but the accused may regard us as having no more self-awareness than could be stuffed into a thimble.

Telling the truth about others is rarely enough recommendation in itself. The process may be nothing more than scapegoating. And at the end of that process, we usually end up with a victim not a convert. This does not mean, however, that we are condemned to silence, rendered incapable of making our reservations felt about people and issues, but that people will pay more attention to what we have to say when they detect that we are aware of our own shortcomings and that our criticism does not emerge from self-righteousness.

In the language of the Gospel, criticism must come from the store of goodness in our heart. If that goodness is absent, we would be better keeping silent. This is because of the fact that When our own scars of conscience glow in the dark, others will be more inclined to heed our words.




