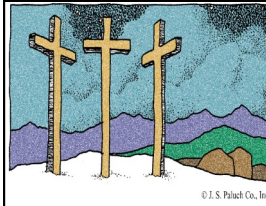

Third Sunday of Lent
March 15, 2020

In today's first reading from Exodus, we hear of the people grumbling against Moses, after being led out of slavery in Egypt. How often do we grumble against the Lord when our prayers aren't answered when we ask for something? Our unhappiness is because we don't trust in the Lord. We need to trust that when the time is right, our prayer will be answered.

Our Responsorial Psalm, Psalm 95, is used in the Morning Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours. "Do not harden your hearts as at Meriba (the place of quarreling) and Massah (the place of testing).

In our second reading, St. Paul identifies God the Father; Jesus Christ the Son; and the Holy Spirit. Our faith comes from God through Jesus Christ, and because of the Resurrection, we have hope in our resurrection. In our Baptism, we received the love of God, come to us through the Holy Spirit. Thus, we have Faith, Hope, and Love, all through the Trinity, The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

In our Gospel today from John, we hear of the events that took place at the well in Samaria, a region that Jews avoided as much as possible. Why did Jesus elect to go through Samaria? Could this possibly be Jesus' way of showing his disciples that He didn't come to save only the Jewish nation, but to save all of God's children? For us, is Jesus giving us a glimpse of confession? Jesus knows the woman's past, her sins, and leads to her conversion and then the conversion of other Samaritans.

Jesus has blessed some priests with the gift of knowing the hearts of penitents. St. Padre Pio was one blest with this gift, and he often related to penitents their unconfessed sins which then led to a good confession. It's up to us to make a thorough examination of conscience and then approach the sacrament of Reconciliation prayerfully. We may think that our sins are unforgivable, but Jesus told St. Faustina in Paragraph 723 of her diary, "The greater the sinner the greater the right he has to My mercy."

We're at the half-way point in our Lenten journey. Are we headed in the right direction? We still have time to get "right" with the Lord. We can join the chorus of the other Samaritans, ... "we know that this is truly the savior of the world"

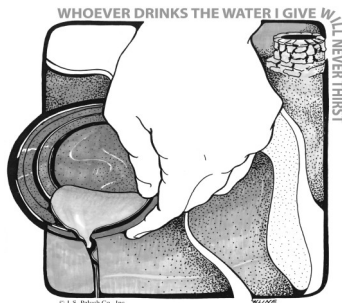

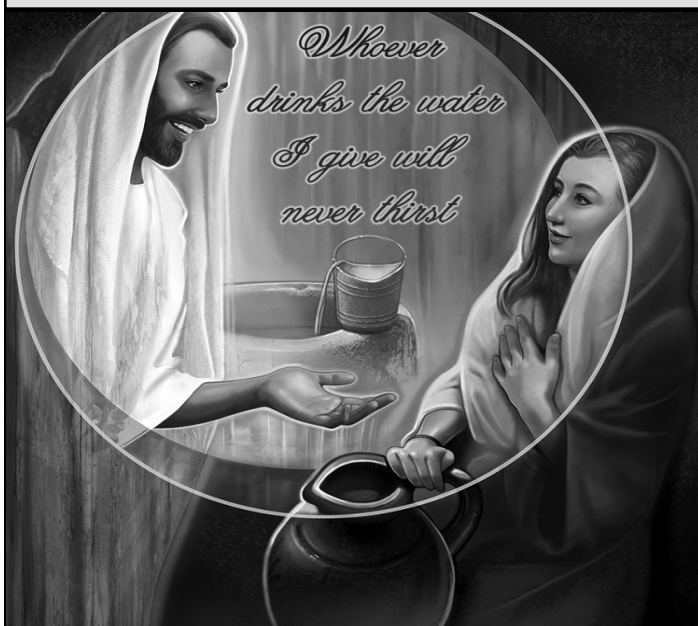

Pilgrimage For Healing

In September of this year Archbishop Wester declared the period between September 14, 2019 and April 10, 2020, to be a period of pilgrimage, with El Cerro de Tomé as one of the pilgrimage destinations. San Miguel parishioner, Ricardo Berry, whose father built the Calvary monument on El Cerro de Tomé, is organizing a group pilgrimage to El Cerro during the Lenten season. The proposed pilgrimage for healing would consist of about a ten mile walk, beginning at the intersection of State Highway 47 and Highway 309 (East River Road) to the summit of El Cerro de Tomé. The pilgrimage route will pass by the Immaculate Conception Church in Tomé where the group will take a scheduled break for rest and prayer. Pilgrims who are not able to walk the entire route can join the group there for the final two miles.

Proposed Pilgrimage Schedule (Saturday—March 21, 2020)

- 7:30 a.m. Initial prayer service at San Miguel
- 8:00 a.m. Carpool from San Miguel to starting point
- 9:00 a.m. Arrive at starting spot and begin walking to El Cerro de Tomé
- 12:30 p.m. Arrive at Immaculate Conception Church. Meet other pilgrims who opt for the shorter walk
- 2:00 p.m. Begin climbing El Cerro de Tomé / Pray the Stations of the Cross
- 3:30 p.m. Complete the climb and Stations of the Cross
- 4:00 p.m. Carpool back to Socorro
- 5:00 p.m. Concluding prayer service at San Miguel

(Note: If the Pilgrimage takes longer than anticipated then the concluding Mass will be at the 7:00 p.m. Mission Mass at San Jose Mission in Luis Lopez)

The journey itself will consist of contemplation and personal prayer during walking, and group prayer and singing during occasional rest stops. Participants will provide their own water and food. Additional details, including a date, will be developed with input from people who wish to participate.
