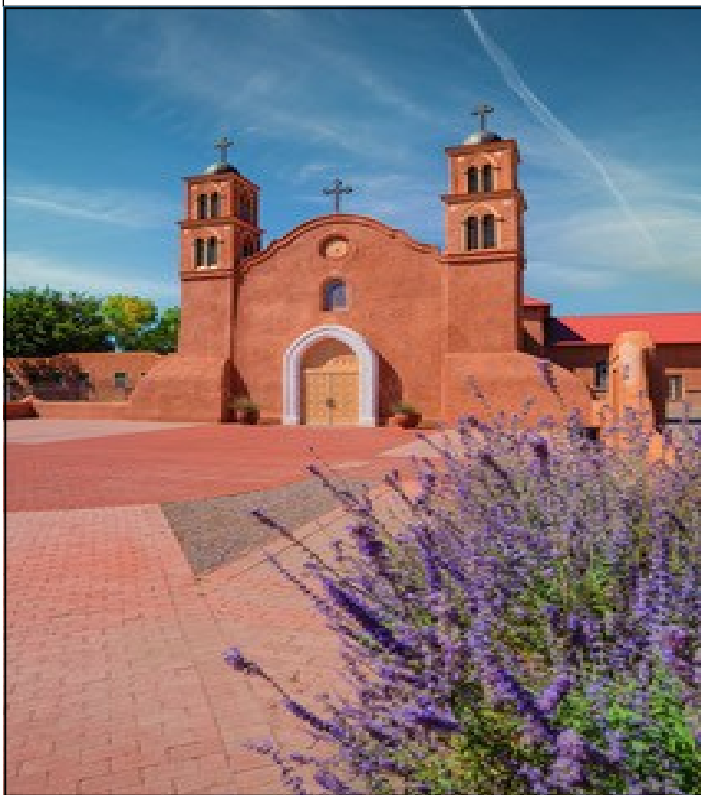

### 70 or 72?

In the Gospel reading for today we read that in addition to the apostles, Jesus sent out 72 others to evangelize. This simple number conceals much scholarly speculation, ongoing since before the time of Jesus. The gospels take great pains to show how Jesus is the new and greater Moses. For example, what Moses did in the physical realm, freeing the Israelites from bondage to Pharaoh and leading them through the wilderness to the Promised Land, Jesus does in the spiritual realm, freeing his people from slavery to sin and death and leading them through the wilderness of this life to heaven, the new Promised Land. In Numbers 11:16-30 Moses appoints 70 elders to help him administer the Mosaic covenant and govern the ever-increasing number of Israelites. God has the Spirit come down upon them and they receive a share of the Spirit that Moses has. But here the plot takes a twist. Two of the elders, Eldad and Medad, missed the gathering with Moses, but the Spirit fell on them as well. It's an odd detail and might be the source of the scholarly speculation among the early Church Fathers and Jewish Tradition. Although Numbers 11 indicates that there were 70 chosen, in the Jewish Tradition (e.g. the Talmud and Midrash) some interpretations suggest Moses selected six men from each of the twelve tribes, totaling 72, and then drew lots to choose 70. In the Christian tradition about half of the early texts of the Gospel of Luke say that Jesus sent 72, the other half saying the number was 70. However, whichever number Moses and Jesus chose may have its origin in Genesis 10 where the nations that spring from the sons of Noah are listed and number 70 (the Septuagint listing 72). This is why 70 or 72 became a symbolic number in Jewish tradition, representing the totality of the nations of the world. Augustine and Origen acknowledged both variants, treating the difference as symbolic, not contradictory. For them the number is a theological bridge linking all the nations of the world to Jesus' mission. It makes Jesus' selection of the 70 or 72 more meaningful as what Luke is describing in a very Jewish way is that it is Jesus' intent to evangelize all the nations, not just Israel.
