

#### **SACRAMENTS**

To receive Sacraments at San Miguel Church, you must be registered and active at the Parish. If you are unsure if you are registered, please contact the Parish Office to verify.

**Baptism:** Pre-baptism instruction is required for parents and god-parents. Sponsors/godparents must be practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church, at least 16 years of age, have received all their Sacraments of Initiation and if married, must be married in the Catholic Church. If the godparent is single, they must not be co-habiting. Parents and godparents must attend baptismal classes before the baptism of the child. **The next class is August 7, 2025**. Parents must register their child at least two weeks before attending class. Contact the office for additional information.

**First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion:** This is a two-year program that begins in the 2nd grade. Contact the Religious Education director for additional information.

**Confirmation:** This is a two-year program that begins in the 8th grade. Those teens who are registering for Confirmation classes must be Baptized and have received their 1st Holy Communion. Contact the Religious Education director at the Parish Office for additional information.

**Marriage:** Couples who plan to marry at San Miguel Church must contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. A mandatory pre-marriage program is required.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office.

**Funeral Mass:** The cost for funeral services is \$150. Please contact the office for additional information and to coordinate services as soon as possible.

...that is, with urgency, fervor, deep dependence, and total surrender. These voices remind us that desperate prayer springs from the soul's awareness of its complete need for God, especially in trial, temptation, or fear.
