SACRAMENTS

To receive Sacraments at San Miguel Church, you must be registered and active at the Parish. If you are unsure if you are registered, please contact the Parish Office to verify.

Baptism: Pre-baptism instruction is required for parents and godparents. Sponsors/godparents must be practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church, at least 16 years of age, have received all their Sacraments of Initiation and if married, must be married in the Catholic Church. If the godparent is single, they must not be co-habiting. Parents and godparents must attend baptismal classes before the baptism of the child. **The next class is February 5, 2026 at 6:30PM.** Parents must register their child at least two weeks before attending class. Contact the office for additional information.

First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion: This is a program that usually begins in the 2nd grade and lasts a minimum of two years. Contact the Religious Education director for additional information.

Confirmation: This is a program that usually begins in the 8th grade and lasts a minimum of two years. Those teens who are registering for Confirmation classes must be Baptized and have received their 1st Holy Communion. Contact the Religious Education director at the Parish Office for additional information.

Marriage: Couples who plan to marry at San Miguel Church must contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. A mandatory pre-marriage program is required.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office.

Funeral Mass: The cost for funeral services is \$150. Please contact the office for additional information and to coordinate services as soon as possible.



Answers to the Bulletin Trivia Challenge. (1) The different colors give visible expression to the character of the mysteries of faith celebrated and to mark the faithful's journey through the liturgical year, green for Ordinary Time, violet for penitential seasons, white for major feasts, red for martyrs and the Holy Spirit (See GIRM, no. 345). (2) The priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning and end of Mass as an ancient act of veneration, expressing reverence for Christ whom the altar symbolizes as the living stone and center of the Eucharistic sacrifice. (3) Mary, the Mother of Jesus, Saint John the Apostle (the "beloved disciple"), and Mary Magdalene (4) The place where the readings and Gospel are proclaimed is the ambo (5) The word "hosts" refers to the vast armies of angels and the entire heavenly court who ceaselessly praise God, as described in Isaiah 6:3 and echoed in the liturgy to unite the earthly Church with the worship of heaven.
