



It is with a heavy heart that we announce the passing of our beloved sister and auntie, Annie Anaya. Annie passed away on Wednesday, May 7, 2025 at the age of 79. Annie was born to Felipe and Maria (Gonzales) Anaya on October 12, 1945.

While guiding the teens of her Parish, she would forever be known as Auntie Annie to all. One year after retiring from the Co-op, she began her faithful dedication to serving the Catholic church at San Miguel Mission. Annie served in every way she could because of her love for the Catholic faith. She was an administrator, a Eucharistic minister, a Mayordomo, lector, youth group director, and a confirmation instructor. As a result of her selfless devotion to the parish, she was honored with the St. Francis of Assisi Award by the Archdiocese of Santa Fe in 2002.

Children always filled Auntie Annie's home and heart. Her nephews, nieces, great- and great-great nephews and nieces, as well as her godchildren meant the world to her. The love she had for them and the love they had for her will endure for generations to come.
